In order that I may commence practice - I shall be leaving here in about 7 weeks about the 22nd of April - and I shall come home then by way of Liverpool - I have now left of my money about £5 which I think will be sufficient - untill I shall be leaving here - I intend passing as a physician - to get the Degree of. M.D. after my name, which is the highest honour in the Profession - and for that purpose I shall go up to London - in July next to be examined for the first time for it - and soon after that I shall pass as a Surgeon also - and I think that I better delay coming to see you as I come home now - untill I shall be going up to London - which will be about the 4th of July as I shall be examined about on the 6th of July - I shall not require to stop any time there only for a day or two - and then I shall return through Manchester - and so I think it will be well to come - My Dear
